### **Submission of views on possible targets, indicators and baselines for the post-2020 global biodiversity framework and peer review of a document on indicators**

In recommendation 23/1, the Subsidiary Body on Scientific, Technical and Technological Advice (SBSTTA) requested the Executive Secretary to invite written submissions from Parties and others on views on possible targets, indicators and baselines related to the drivers of biodiversity loss as well as on species conservation and the mainstreaming of biodiversity across sectors in relation to the development of the post-2020 global biodiversity framework.
